Scientist at Cancer Research Center at University of Salamanca



MANUEL FUENTES graduate in Chemistry and Biochemistry by the University of Salamanca (Spain). After his Master in Biotechnology at University of Bielefeld (Germany), he joined at Biocatalysis Department at National Spanish Research Council (Madrid, Spain) for his PhD Thesis, entitled "Design and development of conjugation and immobilization methods of biomolecules for diagnostic methods useful in Genomics and Proteomics". Afterwards, he moved to Harvard Institute of Proteomics at Harvard Medical School (Boston, EE.UU.), during almost 8 years, when he was working on biomarker and drug discovery in tumor and autoimmune pathologies by using a combination of high-throughput label-free proteomics approaches. In 2010, he joined as a scientist at Cancer Research Center at University of Salamanca, where his research is focused on biomarker and drug discovery in hematological diseases, mainly for personalized medicine.

Manuel Fuentes is co-author of >100 peer-reviewed papers (ISI web of Knowledge) in international journals, 10 licensed international patents, 10 book chapters, and more than 50 invited lectures in national and international meetings. In 2010, HUPO awarded Manuel Fuentes as "HUPO Young Scientist" for his contributions in the field.
